

This table lists recommended courses for economics majors who have not chosen a transfer college. If you have chosen a transfer college, consult the transfer college's website or <u>Transfer Programs</u> on the TTC website to determine your requirements.

The Associate in Arts degree at TTC requires at least 60 credit hours. Students should not enroll in more than 15 hours with the same prefix (e.g., ENG). Courses are three credit hours unless noted and can only count once for the AA degree.

<sup>2</sup> If you are not confident in your writing skills, this course has fewer written papers and is a good choice while you are developing your skills in ENG 101 and ENG 102.

<sup>3</sup> If you are not interested in completing Spanish (SPA) or French (FRE), please consult the transfer college's website or <u>Transfer Programs</u> to determine whether your transfer college requires a language course. High school Spanish or successful completion of SPA 100 within the last five years is strongly recommended.
