



Occupational Therapy Assistant Program Associate in Applied Science

Applicants will be admitted to this program on a “first-qualified, first-admitted” basis. Applicants are considered qualified for admission to the next available class when they meet **all** TTC and program requirements. Classes begin **Summer Semester**.

Program Admission Requirements

In addition to meeting the college’s admission requirements, including submission of official high school and college transcripts, applicants must complete all of the following requirements:

1. Complete the **Health Sciences Application** through the TTC Portal. Application link can be found on the TTC Health Sciences webpage.

Note: When the number of applicants qualifying at the same time exceeds space available in the program, admission will be prioritized according to the date and time that the Health Science application was received in the Admissions office.

2. Provide proof that all general education courses (prerequisite courses) required in the Occupational Therapy Assistant program have been completed.
 - a. These courses must be completed with a minimum grade of C.
 - b. Achieve a minimum cumulative 2.5 GPA in the two required science (BIO 210 and 211) and math (MAT 120) courses.
 - c. Laboratory science courses and AHS 104 Medical Vocabulary/Anatomy must have been taken within five years of acceptance into the program.
3. Complete the Information Session on the TTC Portal page for Occupational Therapy Assistant and achieve a score of 100% on the online quiz following the session to verify the information was reviewed and understood.
4. Complete the OT Observation Video on the TTC Portal page for Occupational Therapy Assistant and achieve a score of 100% on the quiz following the video to verify that the information was reviewed and understood.
5. Electronically submit a Statement of Completion form found on the Health Sciences webpage to HealthSciencesAdmissions@tridenttech.edu.

Program Technology Requirements: Technologies required for the OTA Program include internet access, personal laptop or tablet with webcam, and apps accessibility. Chromebooks are not compatible with requirements and therefore cannot be used.
