# Program Background

TRIO Talent Search (TS) is a federally funded program sponsored by the U.S. Department of Education. TS provides information and support to help middle and high school students excel academically.

## Goal and Mission of Talent Search

The mission of the Talent Search program is to encourage, inspire, challenge and support students in their efforts to achieve academic success with the goal of enrollment in a post-secondary educational institution.

The goals of TS are retention in and graduation from a secondary school, and a positive placement in postsecondary school including college, university, trade, technical or proprietary school.

## Program Eligibility

The TS program at Trident Technical College is funded to serve 850 participants:

- Youth and young adults between the ages of 11–27 who meet certain federal income guidelines
- Potential first-generation college graduates (neither parent/guardian has graduated from a four-year college)
- U.S. citizen or permanent resident
- Those who are determined to have a need for TS services
