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#### WHAT IS DUAL ENROLLMENT?

Dual Enrollment Programs allow students the opportunity to get an early start on college career before HS graduation completion.

- DUAL CREDIT: Earn high school credit and college credit
- EARLY ADMIT: Earn college credit that does NOT count toward HS graduation

## Who is Eligible?

#### **DUAL CREDIT**

#### **EARLY ADMIT**

- High school students in grades
   9-12\*
- \*9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students must demonstrate exceptional ability
- Must reside in Berkeley, Charleston, or Dorchester county

- High school students in grades 11 and 12
- Must reside in Berkeley, Charleston, or Dorchester county

### WHY DUAL ENROLLMENT?

National studies suggest that students who receive college credit while still in high school:

Are more likely to graduate from high school

Are more likely to continue their education after high school

 Have more success during their first official year of college than their peers

## **Collegiate Expectations**

#### **Subject Matter**

- Designed for a mature learner
- Potentially controversial subject matter
  - Warfare, mental health, cultural practices
  - May be emotionally charged
  - May challenge your current belief system
  - Presented to increase understanding NOT a personal endorsement of a topic

### **Course Policies**

#### **Departmental and Class Syllabi**

- States TTC and class policies
  - Course work, attendance, late or missed work, grading, student conduct, etc.
- ASK QUESTIONS if you don't understand the policies, and then KEEP ASKING!
- Policies are not a suggestion They are enforced

#### TTC's "Student Code"

- Syllabus will include sections from the "Student Code" within the TTC Student Handbook
- Classroom Civility
  - "Show courtesy and respect to instructors and fellow students" both online and in the classroom
- Right to teach and right to learn is enforced

Impact of Dual Credit on High School Records  Earn one unit toward the high school diploma for each three-credit-hour college course successfully completed

 Student performance in dual credit courses will directly affect high school records and graduation requirements in accordance with SC Uniform Grading Policy

# **Grading Procedures**

 TTC will report the earned numeric grade for each student to the high school or home school association

 Each institution will award final grades according to the applicable grading scales

# **Grading Procedures**

TTC Grading Scale	SC Uniform Grading Scale

## **Drop/Add Period**

Students have a short period at the beginning of each semester/term to drop or add a course

Drop Period	Add Period
Term/Quarter (7-9 weeks) = first 7 business days of the term	Term/Quarter (7-9 weeks) = first 3 business days of the term
Semester (14 weeks) = first 7 business days of the semester	Semester (14 weeks) = first <u>5</u> <u>business days</u> of the semester

## **Course Withdrawal Policy**

- After the Drop/Add period, if a student chooses to withdraw from a TTC course:
  - A grade of "W" will appear on the TTC transcript
  - A numeric grade of "50" will be placed on the high school transcript in accordance with SC Uniform Grading Policy







#### **Tuition and Fees**

Students taking courses for dual credit are responsible for cost of tuition and books unless otherwise directed by high school or school district.

- SC Lottery Tuition Assistance is available for eligible students enrolled in 6 or more college credit hours within the same semester
- The SC WIN (SC Workforce Industry Needs) Scholarship is available for eligible high school students enrolled in career and technical programs
- Need-based scholarships are available for high school students who meet the federal family income guidelines for the free/reduced lunch program

## **Tuition Costs for 2024-2025**

#### **Tuition and Fees**

- For courses taught by TTC faculty, tuition is assessed at the regular per-credit-hour rate for the college
  - \$188.69 per credit hour
  - 3-credit-hour course = \$566.07
  - Some courses will include additional course fees

# State-Funded Scholarships for HS Students 2024-2025

#### **SC LOTTERY TUITION ASSISTANCE**

- Students must be:
  - SC resident (lived in SC for at least 1 year)
  - U.S. citizen
  - Enrolled in 6 credit hours during the same semester
- High school students DO NOT need to file FAFSA
- Does NOT start our state's 8 semester scholarship clock for LIFE scholarship
- Scholarship provides a discount towards total tuition cost, does NOT cover textbook/materials costs

#### SC WIN SCHOLARSHIP (SC WINS)

- Students must be:
  - SC resident (lived in SC for at least 1 year)
  - U.S. citizen
  - Enrolled in an eligible career and technical program
- Students must submit a scholarship affidavit to be considered for scholarship
- Scholarship covers tuition, fees and materials for courses in eligible career and technical program

# Need-Based Scholarship Program 2024-2025

Students must be identified by high school or school district as eligible based on the Pupils-in-Poverty (PIP) Indicator in official school Student Information System.

- Must be enrolled in <u>6 credit hours</u> during the same semester
- Must maintain a college GPA of 2.0 or higher
- Scholarship covers remaining tuition and course fees after SC Lottery Tuition Assistance
- Scholarship does NOT cover the cost of textbooks or digital course materials.
- Homeschooling families can apply for eligibility through TTC's Financial Aid office

## Impact on LIFE Scholarship Eligibility

Grades in TTC courses impact your ability to earn and retain LIFE scholarships.

- First Year Grades are calculated into high school GPA used to determine initial eligibility.
- Subsequent Years Grades are calculated as part of the ongoing "All College GPA" used to determine continued eligibility.
  - 3.0 on 4.0 scale for <u>all college grades earned</u> at all eligible institutions

## **How to Qualify?**

#### **Students must:**

- Have permission from high school counselor/principal or home school association
- Have permission from parent/guardian
- Demonstrate academic readiness as required by the college

#### **Proof of Academic Readiness**

Students must meet the same academic requirements for enrollment in college classes as any traditional college student.

SAT	<b>530</b> Evidence-Based Reading & Writing	<b>600</b> Math
АСТ	<b>19</b> English	<b>22</b> Math
Next Generation ACCUPLACER	237 Writing 237 Reading	Math score varies depending on level of math desired

Alternative placement options are available for students who are unable to qualify via SAT/ACT or TTC ACCUPLACER.

STEP 1

 Visit <u>www.tridenttech.edu</u> > Get Started > High School Students > Dual Enrollment Online Application

STEP 2

 Review Dual Credit Information and Student Responsibilities Sheet with parent/guardian

STEP 3

- Upload Dual Credit Signature Page and proof of academic readiness to online application.
  - Signature Page must be signed by student, parent/guardian, and school counselor/principal or home school association

## **How to Register for Classes**

Qualified students may enroll in courses that are offered at any TTC campus or site, or through TTC's Online College. Courses may be taken before, during or after school, or during the summer.

- Registration for students taking courses on the high school campus will be handled by the high school.
- Registration for students taking courses online or at a TTC campus or site must be requested by the student using the Dual Enrollment Add/Drop Request form through the Student Portal.
