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## **NUR 100 - Pre-Nursing**

**Lec:** 1.0 **Lab:** 0 **Credit:** 1.0

### **Course Offered**

Fall

This course covers an exploration of nursing and other health care careers as a possible career choice and explores strategies to be successful in a clinical nursing course.

### **Prerequisite**

ENG 101

**Grade Type:** Pass/Fail

**Restrictions:** Restricted to students in the PN or ADN program. Students who have completed more than 8 credits of NUR courses are not eligible to take this course. Only students who had an unsuccessful attempt in NUR 102 or NUR 104 are eligible.

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## **NUR 102 - Basic Nursing Care Skills**

### **Course Offered**

This course introduces basic nursing care skills, which are applied in long-term care and acute care settings.

CPR certification and all required immunizations/titers/tests including the Hepatitis B vaccine series, major medical insurance, drug screen, criminal background check and mandatory in-service requirements

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## **NUR 104 - Nursing Care Management I**

This course focuses on the knowledge, skills and abilities that are fundamental to nursing practice with application in acute or extended care settings.

Students successfully completing this course are eligible to apply to take the NCLEX-RN to become a registered nurse.
