# **ECD 108 - Family and Community Relations**

# **ECD 109 - Administration and Supervision**

# **ECD 131 - Language Arts**

Opportunities are provided to develop listening, speaking, prereading and prewriting skills through planning, implementation, and evaluation of media, methods, techniques and equipment. Methods to select, evaluate and present children's literature are included.

# **ECD 135 - Health, Safety and Nutrition**

Certification preparation is provided in pediatric safety, CPR and First Aid. Guidelines and information on nutrition and developmentally appropriate activities also are studied in the course.
